

Brandon RNIP & Immigration Representatives

An RNIP Applicant may choose to use a representative to act on their behalf or to assist them with finding a qualifying job offer, completing their Brandon RNIP application for Community Recommendation or completing their Permanent Resident application.

RNIP Applicants and/or their representatives cannot pay a fee or financial compensation to an employer in exchange for a qualifying job offer.

Be aware that there are two types of representatives: paid and unpaid. Only some people can charge a fee or receive any other type of payment. These people are called "authorized" representatives. They are:

- lawyers and paralegals who are members in good standing of a Canadian provincial or • territorial law society
- notaries who are members in good standing of the Chambre des notaires du Québec and
- citizenship or immigration consultants who are members in good standing of the Immigration Consultants of Canada Regulatory Council

Brandon will not deal with representatives who charge a fee but are not authorized. If you use an unauthorized representative, in Canada or abroad, we may return your application or refuse it.

It is also important to understand that using an Immigration Consultant / Representative does not change how your application will be reviewed or whether it will be approved or rejected. All Brandon RNIP Community Recommendation applications are evaluated and processed the same regardless of whether a representative is used or not.

Immigration representatives cannot guarantee:

- Rural and Northern Immigration Pilot community recommendation approval
- Permanent Resident Approval
- A faster review of your application to the Rural and Northern Immigration Pilot or your Permanent Resident application
- Approval to bring your extended family members to Canada
